2012 BEST SELLING CARS

In 2012 the Top European car models ranking shows stability: at the top of the rankings the first five of 2011 are confirmed: Volkswagen Golf, Ford Fiesta, Volkswagen Polo, Opel Corsa and Opel Astra.

Scrolling through the list of the top twenty the data in contrast are a few: Nissan Qashqai (entered into the top ten in 8th place), Toyota Yaris (+25%), BMW 3 Series and Serie 1 (+8.9 and +16.2% respectively) and Volkswagen Tiguan (+32.7%).

The first of Italian cars is Fiat Panda: with stable sales (-2.3%), it rose in ranking from 13th place in 2011 to 11th last year, making it the most pleasant car in Europe before Fiat 500 (20th) and Volkswagen Up! (31st).

The most significant increase in sales was recorded by Mercedes-Benz B-Class, at +88.8% on 2011: it is increased from 74th to 27th place overall.



TORBOLE-NAGO

Nago-Torbole is located at the north eastern shore of Lake Garda and it consists of two villages: Torbole and Nago. A special feature of the town is the arrangement of the houses like an amphitheatre facing towards the bay.

Torbole (the name is derived from turbines) is a well known centre of sailing and windsurfing due to the constant winds and the prohibition of motor boats. Therefore Torbole is one of the European capitals of water sports and a very popular tourist destination.

One of the most beautiful spots of the town is the harbour, which has retained the original appearance of the fishing village. Goethe has been impressed by the extraordinary winds and the beauty of the village and called it „the country where the lemons bloom.”



Nago is a charming small village with a Mediterranean vegetation which offers a breathtaking view over Lake Garda. Here you can find the Nature Park Monte Baldo, also called „the garden of Europe”, which is well known for its botanical wealth.

PAPA FRANCESCO

On 13th March 2013 Jorge Mario Bergoglio was elected 266th Pope of the Catholic Church. Bergoglio was born on 17th December 1936 in Buenos Aires, Argentina, from a family of Italian origin (Piedmont). He entered the Society of Jesus in 1958, at age 22 and studied chemistry, philosophy and theology. He speaks fluently Italian, Spanish and German.

He became priest in 1969. He was elected Archbishop of Buenos Aires in 1998 and then cardinal by Pope John Paul II on 21st February 2001.

Bergoglio has always shown a particular focus on social issues. He is known for his references to poverty: when he was appointed cardinal, Bergoglio persuaded hundreds of Argentines not to accompany the celebrations in Rome, and give the money of airline tickets to the poor. He is also very close to inter-religious dialogue: a year ago he published a book, “Sobre el cielo y la tierra”, written with Rabbi Abraham Skorka.

Some of these things have been seen during his first speech as Pope, which was very direct, with a strong call to prayer and an insistence on the role of the Pope as Bishop of Rome.

He also decided to wear the cross he had as bishop: a cross rather simple and not gold.
